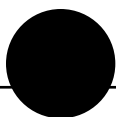

FFA Information

Structure of FFA

The FFA operates on local, state and national levels. Student members belong to chapters organized at the local school level. Agricultural education instructors serve as chapter advisors. Chapters are organized under state associations headed by an advisor and executive secretary, often employees of the state department of education. States conduct programs and host annual conventions.

The National FFA Organization, governed by a Board of Directors and a Board of Student Officers, charters state associations; provides direction, programmatic materials and support; and hosts the National FFA Convention, which draws more than 45,000 attendees each Fall. The National FFA Alumni Association's more than 40,000 members in 1,200 affiliates assist in the continued growth and development of active FFA programs.

Applied Learning

The agricultural education program provides a well-rounded, practical approach to learning through three components: Classroom education in agricultural topics; hands-on supervised agricultural experience, and FFA.

Agricultural Department and FFA Membership

Denton ISD adheres to guidelines and policies provided by the Texas FFA Association. Texas FFA allows local discretion of the school district to adopt more stringent membership guidelines as deemed necessary.

FFA Dues

Annual FFA dues are set by each individual chapter. This includes dues for Local, District, Area, State, and the National FFA Associations. Membership also includes a subscription to the FFA Horizons Magazine which will arrive sometime after January 1st. According to Texas FFA guidelines, members must be enrolled in an Agricultural Science Class to be an FFA member and participate in activities.

FFA Jackets

FFA Jackets and ties/scarves can be purchased through the National FFA website. Please allow 4-6 weeks for delivery. All members are encouraged to purchase a FFA Jacket if they have plans of competing on LDE's or CDE's. Please ask your advisor for help in ordering your jacket online.

Denton Junior FFA

Jr. FFA membership is open to Denton ISD students in grades 3 (8 years old)-8. Dues for Jr. Members will be based on the home campus chapter dues. Joining the Jr. FFA allows the member to participate in local meetings as well as showing at school sponsored stock shows under the discretion and supervision of the Denton Independent School District Home High School Agriculture Teacher. Since they are not enrolled in a high school Agriculture class, they are not allowed to participate in LDE's or CDE's.

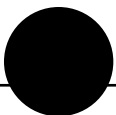
FFA BASICS

Denton County Livestock Association

The purpose of the Denton County Livestock Association is to promote the breeding, improvement, and sale of purebred and commercial livestock; to encourage producers to produce the highest quality of livestock; to establish and maintain a friendly spirit between members of the Association by a friendly exchange of information and ideas on all subjects pertaining to livestock, poultry and their products. This organization sets policy for the Denton County Youth Fair. All parents with children participating in the youth fair are encouraged to become active members of this organization. Dues must be paid by the September meeting. If students are planning to participate in the DCLA youth fair all animals must be state validated in order to show. Your campus Agriculture Science Teachers will have further information regarding tag-in dates and tag orders.

Blue Ribbon Club

The Blue-Ribbon Club is the support group for FFA and 4-H members in Denton County who participate in the Denton County Youth Fair. The Blue-Ribbon Club adds money onto animal that do not make the premium sale. Any parent wishing to participate in this organization is encouraged to do so. The Blue Ribbon Club meets every 1st Monday of the Month or TBA.

Campus Incentive Programs

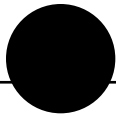
FFA Graduation Chords/Awards Incentive Program

Students of Denton ISD FFA are eligible for FFA Graduation Chords as an incentive program sponsored by the home campus FFA Booster Club. It is up to the Home Campus Agriculture Science Teacher's discretion to follow this criterion to award these incentives.

- 1) Have a minimum of 2 years of FFA membership
- 2) Accumulate a minimum of 300 points from participation in various FFA activities. All activities have a point value, depending on the level of participation.
- 3) All students must have activities recorded in The AET Record Book Tracker

District/County activities	10 points/activity
Area activities	15 points/activity
State activities	20 points/activity
National activities	25 points/activity
Invitational contests	10 points/activity
Community Service activity	10 points/activity

Scholarship Opportunities

Texas FFA Association Scholarship Program:

Graduating seniors apply during the spring semester for these scholarships. The completed application follows a series of checks and must advance from each level to be awarded. Scholarships are based on academic rank (must be in top 25% for Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, top 50% for others), SAT/ACT scores (minimum 950 on SAT, minimum of 20 on ACT) and FFA activities. Students must also interview at each level. These scholarships total over \$2.0 million awarded. Each year the number and amounts may vary.

National FFA Scholarships:

Graduating seniors apply for a variety of scholarships. Applications are available at www.ffa.org. Deadline is February 15.

Denton County Livestock Show:

Students participating in the Denton County Junior Livestock Show are eligible to apply for these scholarships. The application will be available in Ag Science classes, please see your Campus Ag Teacher for these opportunities.

Agri-Science Fair Competition:

Students participating in the Agri science Fair competition are eligible for scholarships. Competition is held in several locations and as much as \$10,000 scholarships are available.

Proficiency, Public Speaking and Star Awards:

Scholarships are available to State and National winners.

Career Development Events:

Top High Individual Honors can bring scholarships at various competitions up to \$10,000. Colleges also scout these contests for scholarship recipients.

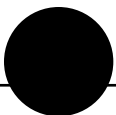

Supervised Agriculture Experience Projects

Supervised Agricultural Experience Programs

A unique aspect of the Agricultural Science Program is the Supervised Agricultural Experience Program (SAEP). It enables students to care for and exhibit livestock projects, develop agricultural crop or horticultural enterprises or experience the other aspects of the agricultural industry. The SAEP is a powerful tool that teaches responsibility, time management, commitment, teamwork and sound financial practices.

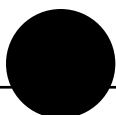

Policy and Guidelines:

Information

The following policies and guidelines apply to the Denton ISD Agricultural Department and Denton ISD FFA Chapters (Braswell High School, Denton High School, Guyer High School, Ryan High School). As a leadership organization, students must be in good standing in and out of the school and are subject to dismissal from the organization for problems in any of the following areas: insubordination, truancy, cheating, drinking, sexual misconduct, drugs, the use of tobacco products or vapes and violations of the DISD student code of conduct or major breaches of the FFA code of ethics.

The FFA advisor and/or Director of Career and Technical Education reserve the right to add or amend these guidelines and rules as deemed necessary. This document will be kept updated and located on the DISD district website. It will be the responsibility of FFA advisors, students and parent to utilize the district website to obtain and/or refer to the most current version of this document.

Student Expectation

Travel for School Activities

Before students can travel to any school sponsored activity the teacher must have on file a field trip release form, and extracurricular medical permission form and any other documentation required by Denton ISD.

Visitors

Any visitor accompanying a Denton Independent School District FFA student and/or parent and attending a Denton ISD sponsored event or activity, must adhere to appropriate conduct outlined in this document. Please allow 48 hours 'notice to your Agriculture Science Teacher for professional fitters, breeders, or groomsmen to enter our facility. Any student who has a visitor or non-Denton ISD member or guest at the facility takes full responsibility for their visitor's actions or misconduct.

Misconduct

Any infraction of district rules, policies or guidelines as set forth in the DISD Student Code of Conduct, DISD Student Co-Curricular/Extracurricular Contract, and/or the DISD FFA Policy Handbook will result in disciplinary action and may cause immediate removal from the program. The Ag science teacher(s) in collaboration with campus administration will have the authority to suspend or remove any member for any infractions. All content of this document is at the discretionary interpretation of campus administration and Director of CTE for determining consequences for inappropriate behavior. These terms are as follows:

- A "Three Strike" discipline system is used by the DISD FFA advisors. Any student failing to fulfill the obligations of the project in accordance to the rules and guidelines set forth by the project advisor will receive a "strike". Infractions include, but are not limited to, missing a project meeting/weigh day without prior notice, neglect of animal (feeder empty, not feeding on time, pen not cleaned, etc.), failure to perform required duties before

and/or during the fair. Once a student has received three strikes, he/she forfeits his/her privilege to show within the Denton ISD FFA Program.

- Other disciplinary problems may result in the removal of exhibitor and animal from the school farm (if housed there) or stockshow, and/or loss of showing privileges with Denton ISD FFA for one or more years.
- Major infractions for immediate removal from Denton ISD FFA Programs include but are not limited to: insubordination, truancy, cheating, drinking, sexual misconduct, drugs, the use of tobacco products or vapes and violations of the DISD student code of conduct or major breaches of the FFA code of ethics.

Eligibility to Participate

Eligibility in the Denton ISD FFA organizations is based on the UIL eligibility standards found in TEA code 33.081 “no pass, no play.”

However, eligibility waivers for International Baccalaureate, Advanced Placement, Honors, or dual credit classes are accepted for only one grading period during the school year for any FFA events above the chapter level. To be eligible for a waiver in these classes the following criteria must be met:

- 1) One failing grade 50 or above OR 2 failing grades 60 or above
- 2) There can be no zero’s or missing assignments during that grading period.

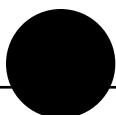
Access to Denton ISD Ag Barn Facilities

To protect the safety and security of DISD students and animal projects, all individuals seeking access to the Agriculture Facilities will be required to complete a Volunteer Application with the Denton ISD Central Office Administration. NO PERSON will be allowed access to these facilities without a security pass from our local application process. Only individuals with DIRECT connection to a Denton FFA student WITH a project at their specific facility will be granted permission to access. This includes immediate family members and parents/guardians. This does not include classmates or fellow FFA members who do not have an animal at the facility unless prior permission from their home Agriculture Science Teacher. **This application is located at <http://www.Dentonisd.net/parents/volunteer/>.**

Open Communications

Please maintain open communication with your Ag Science teacher regarding your participation in the program. Every effort will be made to insure consistent communication with everyone in the program. Every Teacher has their preferred way of communication, it is up to the discretion of the Teacher on how that it is done ie... Remind 101, Email, Group Text Messaging or individual folders. First and foremost, the goal is to make sure the students have a positive learning experience, and it is encouraged that you bring any situations or problems that are negatively impacting our students through the proper chain of command. All communication must be conveyed by the Ag Science Teacher to the Student back to the parent.

Communication between the student and parent must be an integral part of the day-to-day activities. All questions and suggestions by the Ag Science Teacher and the student will be documented in the preferred way of their campus instructor. Ag Science Teachers may use their



personal phones to contact parents unless it is an emergency. Every animal is fed, cared for, and evaluated separately. All suggestions concerning individual students and animals will be written in folders held at the barn. Gossip and assumptions can be very negative, and it is encouraged for everyone to avoid both.

Social Media

Any negative public comments (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc.) may result in removal from the barn and/or the program pending any possible disruption to the school setting. This decision shall be made by campus administration.

Conflict Resolution

Personality conflicts and personal disagreements will arise, but we encourage adults to resolve their issues between themselves in a mature manner. Public arguments at Denton ISD FFA functions and facilities (meetings, stock shows, Ag barn, etc.) will not be tolerated. Such situations may result in one or both parties being ejected from the area and the future participation of that person and/or the student may be in jeopardy. Please refer to the Chain of Command when needing to address any conflicts that arise.

Facilities Care and Respect

We have been provided very nice and very expensive facilities and equipment. If you choose to keep your animal(s) at the Denton ISD Ag Barn Facilities or to use Denton ISD equipment (clippers, pens, etc.), you will need to respect and take care of it. Persons responsible for intentional damage/vandalism (to the property or equipment of the facility, district or other students) will be held financially responsible for repair of the damage, disciplinary actions will be taken, and project removal from the barn will occur.

Denton ISD Equipment

Any equipment owned by Denton ISD is to be used by DISD Ag science teachers or under the direct supervision of DISD Ag science teacher. Equipment is not to leave the Ag Barn facilities unless being used by the Ag science teacher or a student has been granted permission to use the equipment off site. This may include but is not limited to trailers, show boxes, fans, stall set-ups, blowers, hoses, dividers, pig boards, trim tables, chutes, etc.

Parent Expectation

Denton ISD and campus administration reserve the right for discretionary interpretation of the contents in this guide. Any disciplinary action or violation of this document will be at the sole discretion of Denton ISD and campus administration.

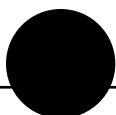
Parent Responsibilities: Your assistance as a parent of a student involved in a Denton ISD FFA Program is very important and valued. To help promote teamwork, good citizenship and success the following must be adhered to:

- Review the contents of the DISD FFA handbook with your child frequently.
- Ensure your child accurately completes and turns in all required paperwork on time to their respected Ag Teacher
- Refrain from the use of tobacco, alcohol, and profanity at all FFA and livestock events.
- Support the decisions and instructions given by FFA advisors, administrators, and other Denton ISD employees
- Provide positive support of your child and the other members of the Denton ISD FFA Programs
- Ensure that your student is on time to all required meetings and that they follow all FFA contract guidelines.
- Provide transportation and accommodations for your student to all required events.
- Use of alcoholic beverages is forbidden on school property, including the Denton ISD Ag barn facilities. In addition, please remember that stock shows and other FFA events are family experiences and also an extension of school grounds when attending under Denton ISD FFA. Adults are not allowed to consume or have in their possession alcoholic beverages in or around the primary/general areas at ANY FFA event/function.
- Parents/students may be asked to leave any DISD FFA sponsored event for inappropriate misconduct, aggressive or disrespectful behavior towards advisors, other parents, students, or any behavior that brings discredit to our organization.
- Any decisions or instructions made by the Ag Science teacher at a school-sponsored event/function are final. Any concerns should be addressed through the chain of command prior to leaving for an event or upon immediate return following an event.
